
The Famous Jim Barlup Rhododendron Hybrids

At the March CVRS meeting Lois Blackmore from the Victoria Rhododendron Society gave an impressive presentation on the hybrids of Jim Barlup.



In her opening commentary, Lois talked about becoming interested in rhododendrons when her husband Roy brought home a copy of Whitney Gardens catalogue in 2003.. She was first introduced to world famous Washington State hybridizer Jim Barlup in 2009 at the conference in Everett, WA. Lois and her husband Roy have since become very close friends with Jim and his wife Judy, and when Jim's medical condition prevented him from travelling to give his presentation, Lois stepped in and presented on his behalf.

As Lois explained, Jim Barlup has been hybridizing



rhododendrons on his half acre property in Bellevue, Washington for the past 37 years. He now has 173 registered hybrids to his credit - 124 of which Lois and Roy have on their property in Langford. If the opportunity arises make sure you go and see the Blackmore property. For his

work in hybridization, Jim was honoured with the ARS Gold medal in 2004.

Jim's naming of his hybrids are always interesting: Always April, Amber Honey, Amber Peach, Amber Sun, Amber Touch, Amber Waves, Apollo's Touch, April's Morn, Blue Tango, Bridal Dreams, Burgundy Mist, Cade's Cove, Calico Candy, Carol's Candy, Cassie, etc., etc.

During her PowerPoint presentation, "A Journey of Love", we saw colourful examples of Jim's many hybrids. Along with 'Champagne Lace', the official flower of the 2015 ARS Conference hosted by District 1 in Sidney, there were also the notable hybrids 'Lois Blackmore, 'Judy's Choice' and 'Peggie Roberts'. Although it is a bit challenging to differentiate between several hybrids due to their similarities, each has a unique trait. The many exquisite photographs were a delight to the senses and make one dream of owning a few someday. Thanks to Lois and Roy for taking the time out to make the presentation to the CVRS. Note that Greer's Nursery has some hybrids available as does Dinter's Nursery and Hidden Acres. Some of the growers will have Barlup hybrids available at the Cowichan Valley Garden Fair in early May. This month we are featuring a number of Barlup hybrids in this newsletter. Enjoy!!

Volunteer Gardeners' Plant Sale at Cairnsmore Place

On Saturday, April 19 from 10:00 to 1:00 the Volunteer Gardeners at Cairnsmore Place will be holding their annual plant sale. There will be over 400 plants ready for planting. You will also find birdhouses and pot trivets made by members of the group.

The group is made up of 18 volunteers who work half a day a week from Spring to Fall. There is no VIHA budget for this work, so money is raised through donations and the plant sale.

The Mill Bay Garden Club, the Cowichan Valley Rhododendron Society and the Cowichan Valley Hospital Auxiliary have made generous donations in the past. Last year the Duncan Christian Seniors' Home Society funded the total redesign of the island at the entrance and the Thorarinson family funded the addition of a fountain.

Money raised pays for fertilizer, mulching, new plants and new projects. Over the past two years a drip watering system was installed in all the beds and a large three-bin compost station was built.

This work can only be done with the support of the Cowichan Valley's gardening community. Thank you.
