## **ARSStore.org - The new ARS Online Store**

## **ARS Online Store**



Where every purchase benefits the

American Rhododendron Society

At the October 4, 2013 American Rhododendron Society Board of Directors meeting, the Board authorized the creation of an online ARS site that would not be selling items but would link to other providers. The online store was authorized to develop a relationship with Amazon as an affiliate store. The online store was also authorized to use the ARS logo and name to sell "ARS" merchandise. Product providers accessed through the ARS online store at ARSStore.org pay referral fees directly to the ARS on sales made from ARSStore.org referrals. These fees from sales referrals go 100% directly to the ARS. ARSStore.org has no expenses, only earnings.

The store has three divisions:

- ARS Logo Merchandise: featuring knit, woven and denim shirts, caps, visors, and computer briefcases.
- Amazon Merchandise: featuring Rhododendron & Azalea Books, Garden Books, Garden Tools, and any other item sold on Amazon.
- Participating Merchants: featuring other merchants who agree to give referral fees to the ARS for each purchase when you mention ARSStore.org.

To access each division, just go to ARSStore.org and from there select what interests you. If you don't see an item, just use the Amazon search feature. Amazon sells just about everything. You get the same low Amazon prices from the ARS store, but by using it the ARS gets a fee for

referring you. As long as you go to Amazon from ARSStore.org before making a purchase, the ARS gets a referral fee.

ARSStore.org has the Main Store, a Canadian Store and a European Store. Canadians and Europeans can use the Main Store which uses Amazon.com, but the shipping can be expensive. The Canadian Store uses Amazon.ca, a Canadian affiliate, which carries many of the same things. If Amazon.ca has the item, the shipping within Canada will probably cost less. The European Store uses Amazon stores in the UK, Germany, France, Spain and Italy which can offer lower cost shipping within Europe. Do not go to the other Amazon stores directly from Amazon.com. If you do, your purchase will not qualify for a referral fee. Go to ARSStore.org first and use links from there.

You may wonder if people who are not members of the ARS may use ARSStore.org. Yes, most certainly! The objective of creating the ARS Store website is to raise money for the ARS. The more money we raise, the better it is for the ARS. Invite all of your friends to use it. Invite your favorite nurseries to add links to ARSStore.org.

The referral rate starts at 4%. If a total of 7 or more items are purchased from Amazon in a month, the rate is 6% or more. Typically it will be between 6% and 6.5%. It is 17% on ARS Logo Merchandise.

At ARSStore.org, every purchase you make results in a contribution to the ARS at no additional cost either to you or to the ARS.

Many major events will take place in 2014. But the one the world will be watching most intensely will be the 50th Anniversary Celebration of the Rhododendron Species Foundation! This is not an event that any Rhododendron enthusiast will want to miss. Nor, in fact, should any serious gardener or horticulturist.

Save the dates of April 25 and 26, 2014, though you will probably want to arrive the evening of April 24<sup>th</sup>, both to be present at the welcoming reception that evening, and to be on time when events begin the following morning. We have made excellent arrangements with the **Hampton Inn and Suites**, where the hospitality will be most gracious.

The program will include talks by **David Chamberlain**, Research Associate at the Royal Botanic Gardens, Edinburgh, and co-author of the most recent authoritative classification of the genus *Rhododendron*; **Harold Greer**, proprietor of the famous nursery, Greer Gardens in Oregon, and **Douglas Justice**, Associate Director and Curator of the University of British Columbia Botanic Garden, Vancouver. And of course **Steve Hootman**, Executive Director of the RSBG, and one of the most intrepid and knowledgeable plant explorers of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

There will also be an emphasis on informal time and tours in the RSBG and its facilities at the height of the rhododendron species flowering season, meeting casually with staff and other delegates in what has become over the last several years an internationally renowned botanical garden, arguably containing the most comprehensive collection of natural rhododendron species in the world.

Plan to join us on this important occasion in this special place during the spectacular spring season.

## 2013 Garden Fair

This was the third year the CVRS held its Garden Fair and Plant sale at the Cowichan Exhibition Hall north of Duncan. The majority of club members helped with setup, operations and cleanup of the 4 hour plant buying event. Island Tractors and Highway Rentals were this year's gold sponsors for the Fair. Mary Gale again worked the checkout counter for plant buyers-a task she has done diligently for decades. About 900 people attended and purchased 890 plants from a record 16 growers and plant sellers from the lower mainland and island. Over 30 growers, non-profit groups and commercial entities rented booths this year.



Gross plant sales were \$11,433 and net income to the club from the event was \$1576 of which \$483 was from the prize raffle. The Murrays created a beautiful truss show for the public with contributions from many members. Bill Dumont's *Rimfire* truss won the People's Choice award. Perennial Ridge nursery owner Rose Rogan was again the most successful plant seller with sales of more than \$1800.

The 2014 Garden Fair will be held on Saturday May 3, 2014 from 10 am to 2 pm.

## 2013 Bus Tour

A long time tradition in the CVRS has been an annual bus tour to visit various rhodo and public gardens on Vancouver Island and the lower mainland. In 2013 it was decided to head further south to north west Washington State and expand an overnight tour to 2 nights.

We have usually recruited participants from many other clubs and organisations on the south island and Saltspring Island. We had 15 people from the Victoria area this year and 22 of our members join the tour of 51 including the driver, Bren McCullough who provided his beautiful Mercedes Benz highway coach.

The tour this year left Duncan early Thursday morning and headed to the impressive Towner Crest garden in Saanich followed by boarding the Washington State Ferry in Sydney heading to Anacortes and Whidbey Island where we visited the Dickerson's impressive garden at Coupeville. We spent the evening at the Coachman's Inn in Oak Harbour with a pleasant meal and libations at nearby Zorba's restaurant. In spite of having the largest tour group we ever hosted the tour went like clockwork and we saw some amazing gardens, sights and yes, many rhododendrons.





The next morning we headed south to Rhododendron Lane where we marvelled at Frank Fujioka's mature garden and breeding centre. It is hard to describe the enormity of work that Frank has done in breeding fantastic rhodos in his lifetime. We then visited the famous 50 acre Meerkerk garden in full bloom and took the ferry to Port Townsend and had a great buffet lunch at the beautiful Clearwater Casino in Suquamish Washington. That afternoon we toured the 150 acre Bloedel Family reserve and garden on Bainbridge Island in Puget Sound. After a short ferry ride we arrived in downtown Seattle at the Sheraton Hotel and enjoyed the evening in this interesting city.




Saturday morning we headed for the famous Kubota Gardens in south Seattle, a unique urban refuge covering more than 20 acres. His 80 years of gardening

effort and 400 tons of stone created a wonderful series of different gardens holding thousands of rare and exquisitely placed plants.

Our last formal tour stop was the Rhododendron

Species Foundation in Federal Way where a plant sale was in full blossom as were hundreds of rhodos on the 25 acres of botanical splendour. The foundation has one of the largest collections of rhododendron species and azaleas. The bonus here is the world class bensei collection testefully staged.
